NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. Class rules shall apply for each division unless changed by this NOR or amended in the SI.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available after noon on July 1st, 2022 at the official notice board here: <https://sailpc.org/official-notice-board>

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The online official notice board is located at <https://sailpc.org/official-notice-board>.
- 3.2. On the water, the race committee will make use of VHF Channel 68.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. The event is open to all boats of the Classes defined as follows:
 - Zim Pram
 - RS Tera Sport
 - Laser (ILCA 7)
 - Laser Radial (ILCA 6)
 - Club 420
- 4.2. Boats may enter the event by registering online at www.SailPC.org
- 4.3. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.4. A minimum of 3 boats per class will be required to have a start for that class

5. FEES

5.1. Entry fees are as follows:

- \$70 for single-handed boats
- \$100 for double-handed boats

6. CREW LIMITATIONS

6.1. Participants must be ages 18 or under for the entire event.

7. ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

8. SCHEDULE

8.1. On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 3:00 pm.

8.2. Ten races are scheduled, and a minimum of one race must be completed to constitute a regatta.

9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

9.1. Sails and equipment may be measured prior to racing and may also be spot checked at any time during the regatta.

10. COURSES

10.1. Courses will be determined by the Race Committee based on conditions but will be Windward – Leeward, triangle or trapezoid shaped of an appropriate length unless otherwise specified.

10.2. Course alternatives will be described in detail in the Sailing Instructions.

10.3. The racing area will be on the Jordanelle Reservoir, South of the Personal Watercraft Ramp

11. SCORING

- 11.1. The scoring system is as follows: The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A
- 11.2. Ten races are scheduled, and a minimum of one race must be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 11.3. A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her 2 worst scores.
 - 11.3.1. When fewer than **5** races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - 11.3.2. When from **6** to **9** races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - 11.3.3. When **10** or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 11.4. Rule A5.3 applies.

12. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS & COACHING

- 12.1. Coaching on the water and during racing is allowed
- 12.2. Very limited coaching is recommended for kids in top 3 positions during racing
- 12.3. The goal is to provide equitable coaching for all kids
- 12.4. Post-race chalk talk responsibilities will be shared by all coaches

13. RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

14. PRIZES

- 14.1. Prizes will be awarded to the top boats in each division as fleet sizes allow.
 - 1st Place – 3 or more boats
 - 2nd Place – 5 or more boats
 - 3rd Place – 7 or more boats
